Accessibility is a University Responsibility

Accessibility is the inclusive practice of removing barriers that prevent people with disabilities from doing what they need to do online.

Provided by UCOP in partnership with Siteimprove, these courses cover a range of topics from basic principles to creating accessible documents, to web development, as well as accessibility considerations for classrooms, marketing and purchasing.

Making Accessible PDFs

In these courses, you will learn about the accessibility guidelines you should use when creating a new document with an authoring program like Microsoft Word or Google Docs. After the PDF is generated, we will walk through the accessibility features in Adobe Acrobat DC and conclude with some tests you can perform to verify if the PDF is accessible. These courses are aimed at anyone who makes documents that will be posted online.
