
The degree audit is in Degree Works. There are no forms in Degree Works.

TERM CALCULATOR


STEPS

1. From the audit, click the ellipsis menu (in the upper right-hand corner) and click the GPA Calculator option.




- 2. From the GPA Calculator window, click on the Term Calculator tab.
 - a. This calculator can be used to predict the cumulative GPA by entering anticipated grades for courses in which the student is currently enrolled.
- 3. The system will auto populate the **Current GPA** and the **GPA units attempted** field which uses the information from Banner.
 - a. Please note that the value populated in the "GPA units attempted" field and the "Units Applied" in the degree block field may differ due to UCR's policies regarding the cumulative GPA calculation.

- b. All unit bearing courses that do not calculate into the cumulative GPA will be excluded from "GPA units attempted" such as repeated courses, Pass/Fail (S/NC), and transfer work from non-UC institutions.
- c. The "Units Applied" value will also depend on whether or not in-progress or preregistered classes are included when processing a degree audit since they do calculate into the total.
- 4. Click on **Add Course** to enter as many courses as needed. Enter **Units** and select anticipated **Grade** earned from the drop-down list. When all class information is entered, click **Calculate**.



5. The output below will display, advising the student of the end of term GPA if courses are completed with the expected grades. Clicking **Recalculate** takes you back to the original window to recalculate the GPA based on a change of units and/or grades.
